

Because our ultimate goal is heaven – for ourselves and for all those we love – we evangelize! St. Michael Faith Formation program is ordered towards helping parents pass on the Faith to their families and to ensure that their children have the tools necessary to freely choose salvation. Guided by this goal:

1. Our parish Faith Formation program is offered at times that support families' attendance at Mass together.
2. We provide parents with "look-ahead" information about what topics are going to be covered each week through the scope and sequence (below) for elementary school and through the LifeTeen website for middle and high school as well as a synopsis of what was presented/discussed during SESSIONS.
3. We provide parents with information about additional resources that are available for parent and student enrichment through Flocknotes, Formed, and the Pflaum Gospel Weeklies site.

Pre-K Through 5th Grade

We offer Sunday and Tuesday in-house options for faith formation in addition to a Home Study option for those who choose to instruct their children in their home. We use Pflaum Gospel Weeklies for Pre-K through 5th grade.

Our programs are designed to follow the scope and sequence for the individual grade-level curriculum guidelines established by the Archdiocese of Baltimore. Each grade level focuses on a specific aspect of our faith. New this year is the **Catechesis of the Good Shepherd** which provides a sacred space for Christian faith formation of children aged 3 to 12 years. It is like a mini retreat center for children, providing a place where they can form a personal relationship with Jesus, the Good Shepherd. Once the children are presented with the materials, they are free to work with these materials that represent essential proclamations of the Christian message. The Catechesis is grounded in scriptural and liturgical study framed by Maria Montessori's principles of education. This allows children to hear the Gospel through the use of sensory-rich materials. The atrium is a special place where children can be with and enjoy God, listen to the Word, and to pray. It is designed to reflect the beauty of creation and God's abiding love. This year we are trained in Level 1 for 3-6 year olds. **Pre-K, K, and 1st grades will do CGS once a month and Pflaum the other weeks.**

Grades 6, 7, 8, 11, 12

Sessions will be held in-person on Sundays and Wednesdays. Our theme this year is 'New Fire' – stay in the city until you have been clothed with power from on high (Luke 24:49). Within the LifeTeen program, we will use EDGE for middle school (6-8), Purpose for Confirmation (9-10) (separate handbook), and Life Nights for high school upperclassmen (11-12).



Armed with a critical mission, the early Church moved forward in faith and boldness. It's that same Spirit — a spirit of power and love — that the Church of today must and will have to move forward, sharing the Gospel with the next generation. It's time to come together, once again. It's time for a New Fire in our homes, parishes, and culture. It's time to call on the Spirit like never before and respond to the mission put before us.

Life Teen is an international Catholic youth ministry and catechesis program that seeks to lead teens closer to Christ. The program emphasis will be on small groups, led by adult core team leaders and peer ministers. Leaders are active in the life of the parish and work each week praying for the teens, connecting with them in a relational setting, and teaching the truth in a comfortable but content-filled program. There are three kinds of nights – Catechetical, Issue, and Social Nights. The catechetical resources are fully referenced with Scripture, the Catechism and YouCat, Encyclicals, and sound doctrine from great saints. The curriculum guides follow the USCCB (U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops) Doctrinal Framework for High School Catechesis.

During each year of the EDGE program, teens will focus on different aspects of faith. Sixth graders will focus on Prayer and Scripture. Seventh graders will focus on Morality and the Sacraments. Eighth graders will focus on Mass and the Creed. The sessions will be formatted as such – introduction, engage, reflect, and respond.





In the Confirmation Purpose program, teens will build on what they learned in middle school. There are 24 sessions to be completed over the course of the 2-year program. The Purpose sessions emphasize evangelizing young people and accompanying them as they become missionary disciples. The curriculum addresses three big questions, "Why believe in God?", "Why trust Jesus?", and "Why be a part of the Church?"

Upperclassmen will focus on developing parish, pastoral, and discipleship leadership skills. They will come to a greater understanding of which Catholic practices are most suited to their personalities and extra-curricular lifestyles. The goal is to enable them in the sustaining and fulfilling of their call both within and outside of the Parish, in college, and beyond.

In addition to the Catechetical Nights, we also offer Social Nights and Issue Nights. Issue Life Nights deal with specific "real world issues" that teens deal with (i.e. drinking, gossip, chastity, divorce, peer pressure, abortion, virtues, etc.). These nights help teens see how their Catholic faith is relevant to every aspect of their lives. Social Life Nights build Christian community and friendships through both on-site and off-site fun.

Coupled with fulfilling their Sunday Obligation of attending Mass each Sunday and Life Teen Nights, we offer additional retreats, service, and worship opportunities throughout the year.

St. Michael's Life Teen program is open to all teens of different social and economic groups; and different cultures and races. Teens are also encouraged to invite friends of different faiths, including the 'unchurched.'

Throughout the year:

1) There will be access to a shared drive of parent letters. Letters are designed to keep parents informed about session content and contain prompts to further the discussion at home. Letters are adapted to speak into the faith of Spanish-speaking parents.

2) Parent Life is a blog which offers practical insights to parents seeking to guide teens through modern culture in a faith-filled way. Website - <https://ltparentlife.com/>

3) Parents are encouraged to strengthen their own capacities as teens' primary catechists. Courses are offered online through the Franciscan At Home program, sponsored by the Archdiocese of Baltimore. Recommended tracks include Ministry of Parenting, Forming Faith at Home, and Hispanic Faith and Family. However, you are welcome to complete any track consisting of several courses or individual modules within a track. If you complete a track, you will receive a certificate. Feel free to set up an account as St. Michael is already registered. There is no cost or limit. Further information if needed will be provided at orientation. We are also open to setting up small groups for parents to complete a track as a cohort! Website - <https://franciscanathome.com/baltimore>



VOLUNTEER REQUIREMENTS

For Those Who Serve in Ministry

All adult (18+) volunteers must be Virtus trained for the protection of our children and youth. For Virtus training go to our the website at <https://www.virtusonline.org/virtus/index.cfm> where you will create your own account and then follow directions. Young people between the ages of 14 and 17 who do ministry with the children must complete “Worthy of the Call” training. “Worthy of the Call” training is done onsite by appointment. Contact Sally (above).



FAITH FORMATION LEADERS & HELPERS

Completion of the Virtus training is the first step for faith formation leaders and helpers. Because ministry to our parishioners is such a vital component, preparation and training is the next step in our faith formation efforts.

Best Practices for Faith Formation Leaders & Helpers at St. Michael

Faith Formation leaders are also known as catechists. A catechist, from the Greek word “to echo,” is someone commissioned by the parish to hand down its faith tradition.

Qualities of an effective leader:

- A desire to grow in and share the Catholic faith.
- Answering a baptismal call to discipleship and sharing the faith with others.
- A commitment to a life of prayer.
- Openness to greet children, to engage them in prayer, to share the joy of the gospel, to read the word of God in class, to encourage faith-sharing, and to enculture children in Catholic teaching and traditions.
- A commitment to entering into a partnership with parents, guardians, and staff.

Requirements

- A practicing Catholic, baptized and confirmed in the Catholic faith.
- Use the Pflaum Weekly booklets given to you by staff and utilize the Pflaum website at www.Pflaum.com.
- Prepare lessons in advance, giving careful consideration to the developmental level of the persons being formed.
- Work as a team with faith formation leaders, helpers, substitutes, staff, and other volunteers.
- Arrive at least 10 minutes early to set up space and greet children and parents. Notify appropriate staff as far in advance as possible when sick or otherwise unable to attend class.
- Possess basic understanding of Catholic teaching, scripture, Catholic tradition; be willing to learn more.
- Be open to an encounter with Christ.
- Attend Mass weekly and on Holy Days of Obligation.

Communication

- Provide good communication to families by sending a weekly email to your parents with a brief synopsis of what happened in class and future plans. You can only be so effective without parental involvement at home.
- Staff will send out a weekly email to parents and catechists with a link to the Sunday readings in Pflaum as well as other happenings at church.
- Notify staff of behavior problems, classroom disruptions, and other incidents immediately. If you plan to take the class on a trip outside of the classroom, notify staff in advance; you'll need your emergency backpack, attendance folder, and possibly (depending on the destination) a walkie talkie.

Safe Environment

- Volunteers go through AoB Child Protection training, fill out an application with references, and complete a background check (Virtus).
- A responsible adult will need to be in the room at least ten minutes ahead of class time.
- Do not let children leave on their own or with siblings under the age of 13. Wait for a parent, guardian, or siblings age 13 and above to pick them up.
- There will be a folder in the classroom with an attendance sheet and information for students in your class. Please take attendance and leave it in the folder in the classroom on a table.
- In case of an emergency, there is an emergency backpack in each classroom with contact numbers for staff members and faith formation catechists and aides who are scheduled to be in the building.
- Our Emergency Response Plan will be incorporated into our training for evacuation and shelter in place at the beginning of each school year. There will be a scheduled evacuation drill.

ANSWERING THE CALL

How to get Involved?

St. Michael Ministry depends upon the support of the community to provide positive ministry to our young people. In the “Renewing the Vision” document, the Bishops of the United States state that ministry to youth is the responsibility of all the parishioners in a parish.

What do you do now?

SACRAMENTS

Baptism



If you have a child who has not been baptized, we would like to invite you to contact Fr. Mike (MRuane@smpschurch.org) or call the rectory at 410-489-4211. Once the preparation is finished, you can schedule the celebration with Fr. Mike, Deacon Harbey, or Deacon Cliff. Baptisms are typically held in the historic chapel on Sunday afternoons at 1:15.

First Reconciliation (Penance/Confession)

The sacrament of reconciliation prepares us before reception of First Eucharist. Parents attend a parent meeting in the fall and receive materials to prepare their child at home. This preparation must be completed in addition to the regular faith formation sessions or home study curriculum. Children may register for this sacrament if they were in faith formation the previous year and are at least rising second graders. The sacrament preparation is free standing for the purpose of allowing parents the option of waiting until they feel their child is mature enough to handle the meaning and significance of these grace-filled sacraments. Once they have received this sacrament, they then prepare to receive their first Holy Eucharist (Communion). Submit a copy of your child's baptismal certificate if not baptized at St. Michael. Reconciliation parent meetings will be **October 10 at 9:00am** or **October 12 at 7:00pm** in the Fellowship Hall. You only need to attend one of those two meeting options. Once your child has completed his/her book, please schedule a time with Miss Joann for parent and child to meet for a chat about the book. JWozniak@smpschurch.org

First Holy Eucharist (Communion)

This sacrament is the most holy of the seven. Again, parents are asked to attend a parent meeting in the winter to receive the materials and overview necessary to prepare their children at home. This sacrament cannot be celebrated without the sacrament of Reconciliation being completed first. Our First Communion Services are held the first two Saturdays in May or at a regularly scheduled Sunday or Daily Mass. Submit a copy of your child's baptismal certificate if not baptized at St. Michael. First Communion Parent Meetings will be **January 23 at 9:00am** or **January 25 at 7:00pm** in the Fellowship Hall. You only need to attend one of those two meeting options. Once your child has completed his/her book, please schedule a time with Miss Joann for parent and child to meet for a chat about the book. JWozniak@smpschurch.org

Confirmation

Continued faith formation is important throughout our lives and especially the year prior to receiving the sacrament of Confirmation, which is celebrated as early as 10th grade in the Archdiocese of Baltimore. High School Faith Formation classes listed in this handbook are not related to Confirmation. To register for Confirmation, please look for our Confirmation Handbook. The program structure and registration form are different and are not included here.

GENERAL INFORMATION & POLICIES

ATTENDANCE

Our programs are designed to follow the national scope and sequence for the individual grade level curriculum guidelines. Each grade level focuses on a specific aspect of our faith; therefore, it is important to maintain strong attendance throughout their session time with us. If a session is missed due to illness or family obligations, it can be made up for by taking the Pflaum Gospel Weekly home for completion in accordance with Archdiocesan policy.

****Please be aware that Diocesan policy regulates that a child must have attended a minimum of one full year of faith formation sessions or have been enrolled in a Catholic school faith formation class prior to the year in which they prepare for First Reconciliation, First Eucharist, and Confirmation.**

PRE-K THROUGH 5TH GRADE DISMISSAL POLICY

For the safety of all Pre-K through 5th grade children, a parent, guardian, or a teen sibling 13 years or older must pick up the child at the assigned room. The teen sibling needs to be introduced to the faith formation leader by the parent.

CANCELLATIONS

St. Michael follows the **Howard County Public Schools inclement weather school closing policy** on schooldays. If weekend activities and sessions are canceled because of inclement weather, a notice will be posted on the parish website www.stmichaelpoplarsprings.org. No decision will be made until 3:00 p.m. unless Howard County has closed their schools early. We will post our Sunday session cancellations by 7:15 a.m. Your safety is paramount.

CATHOLIC TEACHING ON FAMILY LIFE AND MORALITY COMPONENT

The Archdiocese has required that all Christian Formation programs for youth contain the element of personal body safety and morality. The intent of the Archdiocese is to have parish programs **ASSIST** the parents/guardians in their efforts to present this subject from a Catholic Christian perspective.

Kindergarten thru 5th ~ We use the RCL/Benziger Family Life Program which is taught both here in our faith formation sessions and in partnership with parents in the home. The home piece is called the Parent Connection.

Some updated curriculum pieces include personal body safety in regards to bullying, respecting others as fellow Christians, and raising awareness as to what is a healthy relationship and what is potentially not. The idea is to strengthen the dignity of the human person as one of God's creation. You are welcome to come in and review the materials.

Middle School and High School ~ Edge and LifeTeen includes the family life component built into their curriculum called "Issue Nights." Parents are welcome to use the letters in the drive to foster conversations at home. We will get your feedback on sensitive topics during the orientation.

Archdiocese of Baltimore Student Harassment Policy

I. Policy

It is the policy of the Archdiocese to prohibit discrimination, including harassment on the basis of race, color, gender, national origin, religion, age, disability or handicap or protected activity, (i.e. opposition to prohibited discrimination or participation in the complaint process) in its education programs and activities. Each Catholic school shall adhere to this policy with respect to students. (Employees are similarly protected from harassment by a separate Archdiocesan policy.)

II. Scope

This Policy applies to all students in Archdiocesan elementary, middle and secondary schools. The Archdiocese neither condones nor tolerates harassment of students at school, school-related activities or functions, or in any school-related setting. Harassment of students, whether engaged in by other students, teachers, administrators, or others, is prohibited. Violation of this Policy is grounds for disciplinary action up to and including termination of employment or suspension or expulsion from school, depending on the nature and severity of the offense and the individual's disciplinary record.

III. Prohibited Conduct

For purposes of this Policy, "harassment" means verbal or physical conduct that denigrates or shows hostility or aversion toward an individual because of his or her race, color, national origin, religion, age, disability or handicap, or protected activity, that:

Has the purpose or effect of creating an intimidating, hostile or offensive environment;

Has the purpose or effect of unreasonably interfering with an individual's performance; or otherwise adversely affects an individual's educational opportunities.

Harassing conduct includes, but is not limited to, epithets, slurs, negative stereotyping, or threatening, intimidating or hostile acts that relate to race, color, gender, national origin, religion, age, handicap or disability. "Sexual" harassment includes unwelcome sexual advances, requests for sexual favors, and other verbal or physical conduct of a sexual nature when submission to or rejection of such conduct is used as the basis for educational decisions or has the purpose or effect of unreasonably interfering with an individual's academic performance or creating an intimidating, hostile or offensive environment.

FAMILY/HOME STUDY

Offered to children who are entering Pre-K (3&4yo) through 5th grade.

The Home Study option is designed to offer flexibility in scheduling time for faith formation. We use the Pflaum Gospel Weeklies, which are date/time sensitive. You need to pick up materials as they arrive every 8 weeks. Pflaum Gospel Weeklies are approved by the Archdiocese of Baltimore and by the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops. Like the Church's lectionary, PGWs follow a 3-year cycle of Sunday Gospel readings so that each program covers several grade levels without repeating Gospel readings or curriculum material.

Parents are asked to attend the following group sessions with their children. We gather in the fellowship hall at **7:00 p.m.** and spend about an hour on the topic of the night.

Book pick up drive-through for the first set of PGWs will be on **September 27 or October 6 from 5:00pm to 6:00pm.** Pull up in front of the church, and we will be here to hand materials out.

Please **put these dates on your calendar.** These sessions are integral to our Family Home Study program, and they are an opportunity for families to come and interact with others in the parish.
