

### A Message from our Pastor

Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ!

Come this Christmas I will have been your pastor for 33 years! As a parish leader remarked, "It's been a good match!" But, having recently reached my 78<sup>th</sup> year on this planet, I will be handing off the spiritual leadership –much like handing off the baton in a relay- to another pastor who will be appointed by Archbishop William E. Lori by July 2022.

Meanwhile, there is much work to do. Priorities have to be discerned, goals and objectives have to be made, and bills have to be paid in a ministry of shared responsibility, accountability and transparency with fellow disciples in mission and co-workers in the Lord's harvest supported by a dedicated church staff. Even now the Parish Renewal/Planning team is seeking to build up the body of Christ in the priority areas of welcome and encounter, accompaniment, liturgy and mission support.

One such group of parish leaders is the Finance Council working in tandem with the Business Manager, Pastoral Council, and Parish Corporators in creating and handling the budget for fiscal year 2021-22. Looking at the numbers, they have discerned the need to increase the *Sunday Offertory* by 5.4% in the next year. This goal can be achieved if, in addition to current givers, the remaining two-thirds of our parish households not only intentionally practice faithful and prudent stewardship of their material blessings, but also offer their helping hands for the good of the parish. Strides have been made towards developing and encouraging online giving, which, this year, grew to match the traditional envelope giving! Indeed, I am aware and grateful of the excellent track record held by our people in response to various appeals for financial support over the years!

For any number of reasons in "these times that try men's souls", church attendance is down and the amount of people contributing is down. It is up to our civil and religious leaders to discern accurately and respond compassionately to what's happening to human lives in much need of recovery, revitalization, restoration, and healing in body, mind, and spirit.

From my humble position, all I can do is appeal to your Christian faith, hope, and love; and invite you to sustain St. Michael Catholic Church at Poplar Springs-Mount Airy with your suffering love and sacrificial giving.

In summary, Jesus Christ is the meaning of life for Christians. As disciples together in mission, may we help ourselves and others to know Jesus, love Jesus, and share Jesus.

Come, Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful and enkindle in us the fire of your love, so that we may have a right judgment in all things and evermore rejoice in his consolations.

2021 was a year of response to the pandemic and the affects that it has had on the life of our world and faith community. We reopened our doors to public Masses on Sunday, June 14, 2020 as one of the first parishes in the Archdiocese of Baltimore to do so. Since then, we have been steadily reintroducing our normal programs with in person and online options to allow flexibility to our parishioners in these uncertain times. Even with the struggles of the pandemic, our staff and volunteers have dedicated their time and energy to keeping the facilities safe and clean for all. In true Christian fashion, parishioners and visitors were extremely supportive and understanding in following and adhering to our new health and safety guidelines as we reopened our preschool and other youth programs. This was so successful, our preschool even added a third classroom going into the 2022 fiscal year with 46 students enrolled!

While we have resumed most of our in person programs and activities in the past year, we understand the trepidation many still have towards reentering public spaces. Because of this, we continue to livestream our 10:30 Sunday mass on our YouTube and Facebook accounts along with evening Liturgy of the Hours, while other programs such as Alpha are still offering online attendance options. 

### Livestreaming continues our outreach



- As in person Mass attendance recovers, fewer people require Mass to be livestreamed
  - 84 average concurrent views July Sept 2020
  - ♦ 57 average views Mar-Jun 2020 (fourth quarter ending June 30)
  - 980 Facebook followers
- Best Christmas Ever, our livestreamed video and music program, had 888 views. On Easter Sunday, we had 189 views.
- More families requested livestreaming for weddings and funerals so that family from all over the world could participate remotely.






Year over year revenue and expense growth are attributed to our expanded preschool operations. In order to cover our parish operating expenses beyond the preschool, offertory must grow 5.4% next year.

Our parish leadership and finance committees continued to meet over Zoom each month to review the parish financials, offertory trends, and months of operating cash on hand. We controlled expenses when possible as operating revenue continued to decline.

- Households that give declined 27%, but offertory has declined only 2.4% from last year.
- Giving households have increased their offertory! Average weekly gifts are \$29.45, up 37% from last year
- Several households are now utilizing charitable trusts and retirement RMD's in place of offertory donations. Approximately \$45,600 was received from 14 donors.
- Offertory must grow 5.4% to meet our 2022 operating plan


We converted all online giving to Give Central. In the wake of the pandemic, online giving grew to match envelope giving.


Online giving is convenient, safe, and efficient. It provides texting and QR code scanning features for our programs and events.

Sources & Uses of Funds






- 73% of our operating income is from the weekly Offertory
- Evangelization, Faith Formation, and Other er Program Income, such as preschool operations, are self-funded
- Other Operating Income includes bequests, donations from Trusts, IRA's, and Mass Stipends
- Facilities were used less which created savings in utilities and contracted services
- Salaries and Benefits have grown to 53% of our expenses
- Offertory must grow 5.4% to meet our 2022 operating plan

The salaries for paid staff and clergy are allocated to the respective program area to describe our investment in the Parish Mission

- 29% Administration and Facilities
- 26% Evangelization and Worship
- 16% Archdiocesan Assessments and Tuition
- 15% Preschool, Fundraisers. Cemetery, Rentals and Charitable disbursements
- 14% Employee and Clergy Benefits
