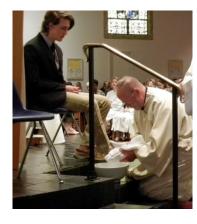

The return to in person Masses brought back the opportunity to receive Communion with the community! We were blessed to have most liturgical ministers return to serving as soon as they were able, though many have moved or "aged out" of serving. Ushers, cantors, lectors, and extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion were the first to return, allowing our celebrations to begin to "normalize". We also welcomed back our altar servers and larger music groups (Contemporary Music Ministry and parish choir), while the Band and other cantors returned to regular ministry. This fall we have issued open invitations for all of our

liturgical ministers, with training sessions ongoing. Fulfilling our baptismal call to serve God through serving others in the parish family, we hope to have even more people filling liturgical ministry roles in the

2022 was a year of growth and recovery for many of our parish groups. Thanks to the efforts of our staff and selfless volunteers, we have been able to reintroduce most of our traditional programs in person! Several groups, such as the Divorce Care Ministry, have benefited from being held online and continue to do so. Our staff and volunteers have dedicated their time and energy to keeping the facilities safe, clean, and accessible for all. In true Christian fashion, parishioners and visitors were extremely supportive and understanding in following and adhering to our new health and safety guidelines as we reopened our preschool and other youth programs. This was so successful, our preschool even added a fourth classroom going into the 2023 fiscal year with 62 students enrolled!

While we have resumed most of our in person programs and activities in the past year, we understand the trepidation many still have towards reentering public spaces. Because of this, we continue to livestream our 10:30 Sunday Mass on our YouTube and Facebook accounts along with evening Liturgy of the Hours, while other programs are still offering online attendance options. 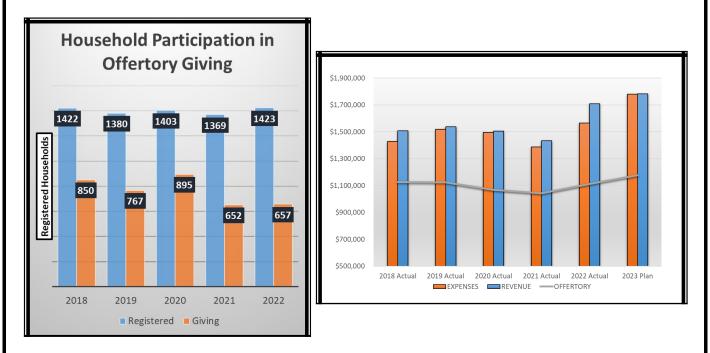

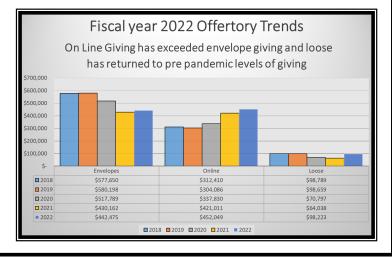


Our parish leadership and finance committees continued to meet each month to review the parish financials, offertory trends, and months of operating cash on hand. We controlled expenses when possible as operating revenue increased.

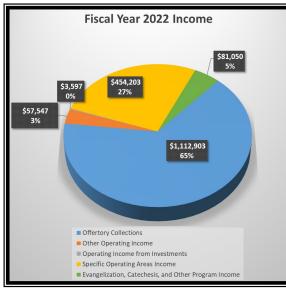
- Registered households that give increased by only a handful, but gifts have grown by 6.8%
- Registered households that give through envelopes and online giving donate an average of \$29 per week
- Several households are now utilizing charitable trusts and retirement RMD's in place of offertory donations, approximately \$36,000 was received from 14 donors
- In 2023, the operating plan will rely on a 5.7% increase to the offertory collections

Online giving via GiveCentral has grown to exceed envelope giving, while loose giving has returned to prepandemic levels!

Online giving is convenient, safe, and efficient. It provides texting and QR code scanning features for our programs and events.

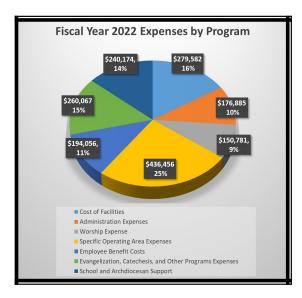
