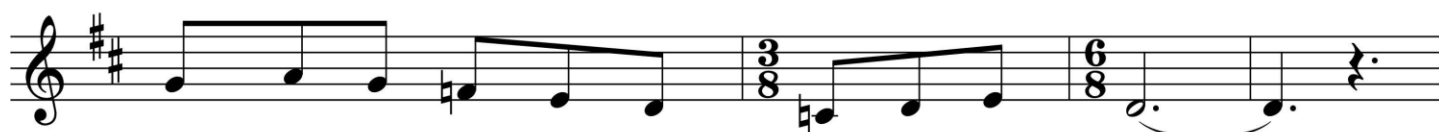

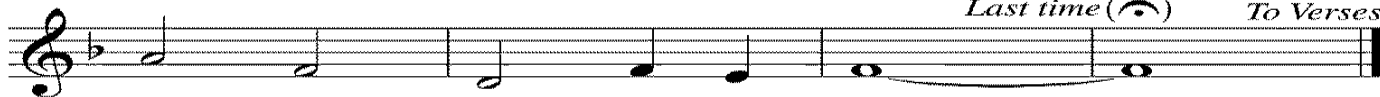

Homily

Nicene Creed

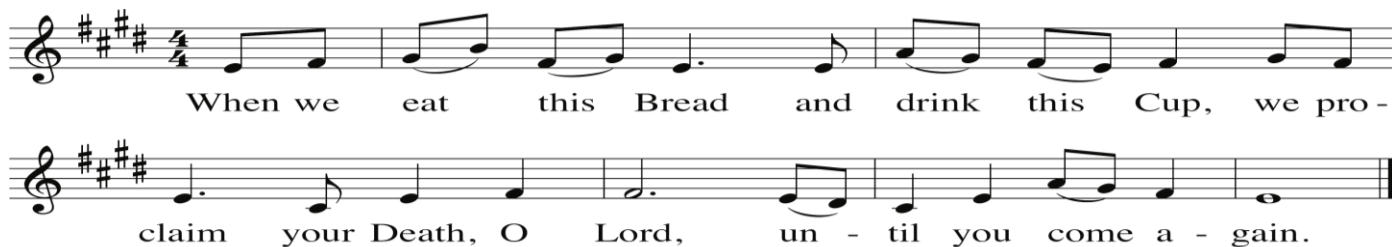

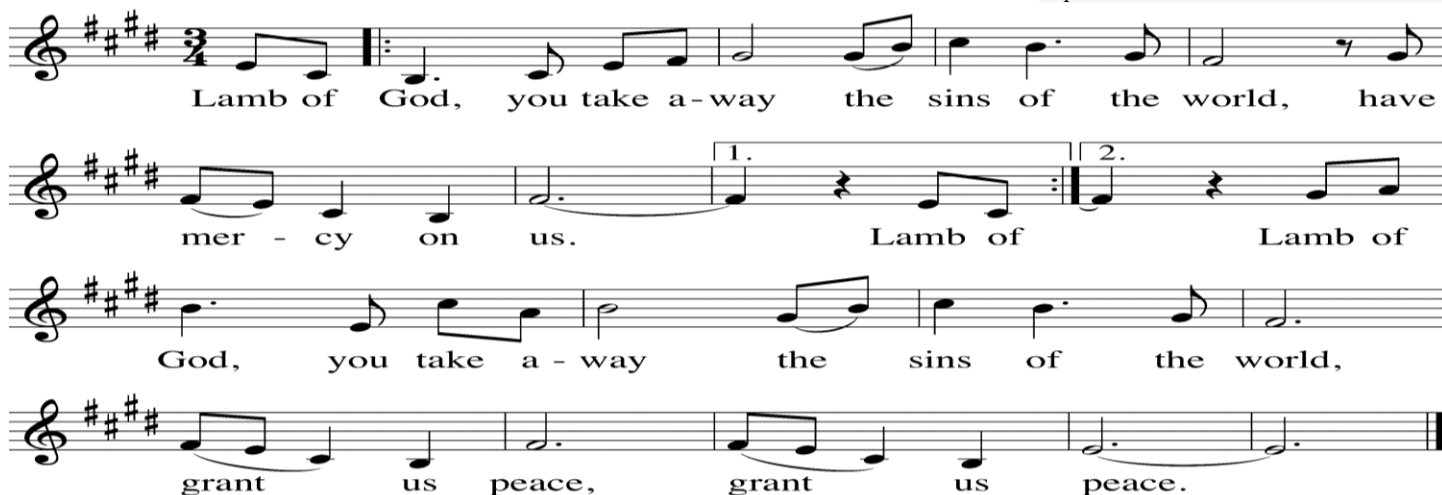
